

Leaders- Check Your Youth Protection Training

Youth Protection Training is required for ALL registered adult leaders and must be taken every two years. To ensure that we fully comply to the BSA's policies, please take the following steps:

Please log on to MyScouting (http://www.myscouting.org) to take or validate the training. Be sure to have your member ID number. The number can be found on your Boy Scouts of America membership card.

- ➤ To take the training: From the MyScouting portal, click on E-Learning and take the Youth Protection Training. The training consists of watching a short video (30 mins.) and taking a post assessment test. Upon completion, print or save the certificate for your record.
- ➤ To validate your training: From the MyScouting portal, click on Training Validation and enter your user name or member ID to search for your training records.

Uniforms

Please wear your Class A uniform to all events unless otherwise noted. Remember all great scouts are not without **their handbook** to make a complete uniform. **A proper uniform includes a tucked in shirt and closed toe shoes!** Please dress for the weather as some activities are outside.



Merit Badge Reminders from Scout Master Gillis

- ❖ Please remember our policy: Troop Meetings are for group and team development and NOT generally for Merit Badge time. (Summertime is an exception and unfortunately summer is over!) There is to be NO merit badge work during patrol meeting time, instructional time and competition. The only exception on Mondays is that a Scout can opt to work on Merit Badges during game time.
- Scouts are still coming forward to work on a merit badge without reading the whole MB book from cover to cover. This is not negotiable and it doesn't matter where the MB was started or with who. To complete the summer camp merit badges or any other please follow these simple rules.
 - 1. Read the book from cover to cover.
 - 2. Bring any completed paperwork to a meeting or merit badge help night and coordinate an approved counselor from the scoutmaster.
 - 3. Sit down with the counselor and explain, show or complete the requirements as detailed.
 - 4. Its not about a memory test it is about comprehension and covering the material as stated.

The second Tuesday of every month the SM will be available at the Mount Pisgah 6-7 PM for those who need extra help with merit badge requirements or advancement.

Once a month our SPL leads his PLC to formulate the plans for meetings and activities. Changes and or improvements are discussed at that time and all scouts should be making sure their representative is up to date on issues, concerns and program request. Another reason to check the Troop bulletin board or web site to keep the ever dynamic and fluid scouting calendar up to date.

It is the individual scout's responsibility when working with his youth leaders and assigned adults on his advancement to make sure all updates are given to our **Advancement Chairperson**, **Mrs. Narayanan**. Trip Paperwork – It is important

Prior to each trip we ask for a permission slip for a scout's participation to ensure we have the parents' concurrence and have the latest info on that scout. This permission slip is important for each activity and should be carefully completed. Include details if you can help with the driving to and from any activity. Please fill them out completely and have them in by their deadlines so we can gather the proper resources to carry out each and every activity. Please make your intentions known early so we can properly make reservations for everyone and have the food and travel arrangements ironed out. Adults wishing to participate are always welcome and appreciated. However, we do require each to be registered, complete the minimum training and have an updated physical. Details are on the troop website.

TRAINED LEADERS- The Backbone of 629 (Reasons to Be Prepared)

Are you planning to get involved with scouts? Want to go on an overnight scout trip? Troop 629 always needs, welcomes and *loves* its volunteers. **If you want to participate in any of our activities we have a couple of pre-training requirements we need to have accomplished.** It's best to get your qualifications completed early so when that trip comes up that you want to go on; you aren't scrambling to get in.

All adults must complete the Youth Protection on line course before registration.

- Complete Adult Registration Form (Found under Forms on Troop website, www.troop629.org, Registration Form-Adult)
- 2. Complete **Youth Protection & Fast Start** (found under *Training* on Troop website). Upon completion of any BSA training program, please email a copy of your course "completion" certificate to **Kathleen Narayanan at <u>kathleen@narayanan.us</u>** or bring a copy to her at the Troop meeting.

To participate as an adult leader in the troop on overnight camping, you must complete on line Youth Protection Training, Fast Start Training and review the Troop 629 Adult Guide. Assistant Scoutmasters and Committee Members must complete the above training and New Leaders

Essentials, SALT, ITOLS and/or Committee Training. Information on these training opportunities is available on the Chattahoochee District Website at www.cdbsa.org

To participate in <u>High Adventure</u>, leaders must complete all the above along with special classes such as CPR, FA, safety afloat, and safe swim.

Join Troop 629 families in this easy on-going monthly fundraiser. By participating in this Kroger program, our troop receives 5% of our total gift card orders each month and each scout received 75% of those funds for their personal high adventure account. These funds go directly to keep the costs down on each of our monthly activities and to help pay for various troop

operational costs and scholarships. The gift cards can be used at any Kroger store or Kroger fuel center [during each use your purchase is deducted and when the amount of the card is depleted, it is kept by the cashier – new cards are issued each month and mailed to you]. There is no service charge – (if you order a \$50 Kroger gift card, you will receive a \$50 gift card)! Troop 629 Scout Activity Scholarships

In these turbulent times please understand fully that our policy has always been and is still the same – every scout should never miss participating in any activity due to a temporary shortfall in their families ability to afford the activity. We have been blessed to have sufficient funds to offer every scout the ability to quickly earn their way through a service project of their choosing. Coordinate with the SM or Committee Chair to bring this about but do not hold back asking if the need exists. In addition, the high adventure bases and camps also normally run scholarship applications for various events, just ask us for the forms if help is needed for a particular event. Scouting is outing and if you miss that portion then it can be rather boring.

Lending Closet

The Troop maintains a scout uniform exchange or drop off point for all to use. With growth spurts for young scouts, it's hard at times to keep them outfitted for activities. Bring in your used uniform pieces including Troop T-shirts. Or feel free to visit the closet for items that your Scout may need.

Grubby Details

During some troop outings, patrol food is purchased by scouts working on advancement requirements (Grubmasters). A scout buying food will get a menu to use with a budget to follow. It's important to follow the list of items/quantities specified as the menu has been planned for patrol guest and other program considerations. Families are asked to purchase designated food from the list and then they are reimbursed by the Troop Treasurer. Families can ask for an advance and handle reconciliation after the trip. Turn your receipts into **Julie Deaton**, **Treasurer**, to be reimbursed for any authorized cost. Non-perishable (leftover) food from camping trips that can be re-used needs to be turned in with

the patrol gear at the end of each trip and is stored by the troop in special patrol containers. This will help cut back on costs for future trips and eliminate waste now on-going.

A Helping Hand

On occasion the troop is able to provide a helping hand in preparing meals for a Troop 629 family going through a stressful situation.
